For those with **November college application deadlines**, please remember the following:

- Transcript Release Forms must be submitted to the counseling office **TEN SCHOOL DAYS BEFORE YOUR DEADLINE**. Make sure your colleges are in the APPLIED section of your Scoir dashboard and that any letters of recommendation are ready to be sent.
- Make sure all required application materials are submitted on time and even several days in advance to allow time for items to be processed by the college. This includes the STARS (self-reported transcript/academic record) and official test scores, for schools that require these items.

If you have questions or need help with your applications, reach out to the Counseling Office!

Today through Thursday, October 30th at 3PM you will have the opportunity **to request a second semester elective course in place of an already existing study hall** (based on availability). The request form will be posted on the Class Of Schoology pages. Space is limited in courses and will be on a first come first served basis. Pay careful attention to the restrictions and process as listed on the form. Reach out to your School Counselor if you have questions.

Do you speak a language other than English at home? Are you taking an advanced level of a world language? If you answered yes to either of these questions AND you are graduating this year, you might qualify for a **PA Seal of Biliteracy!** The Seal of Biliteracy is an award to recognize your language skills and is an impressive credential on your high school transcript, resume, and college applications.
