The mission of the Transition Coordinating Council (TCC) is to promote effective transition planning for students with disabilities from school to adult life.

Reauthorized Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) signed into law on Dec. 3, 2004 by President George W. Bush:

...The term "transition services" means a coordinated set of activities for a child with a disability that:

- Is designed to be within a results-oriented . process, that is focused on improving the academic and functional achievement of the child with a disability to facilitate the child's movement from school to post-school including post-secondary activities. education; vocational education; integrated employment (including supported employment); continuing and adult education; adult services; independent living or community participation;
- Is based on the individual child's needs, taking into account the child's strengths, preferences, aptitudes, and interests; and
- Includes instruction, related services, community experiences, the development of employment and other post-school adult living objectives and, when appropriate, acquisition of daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation
