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1. Purpose SC 1301, 1326, 1327 Title 22 Sec. 11.12, 11.41, 12.1

The Board requires that school age students enrolled in district schools attend school regularly, in accordance with state laws. The educational program offered by the district is predicated upon the presence of the student and requires continuity of instruction and classroom participation in order for students to achieve academic standards and consistent educational progress.

Attendance shall be required of all students\_enrolled in district schools during the days and hours that school is in session, except that a principal or designee or teacher may excuse a student for temporary absences when receiving satisfactory evidence of mental, physical, or other urgent reasons that may reasonably cause the student's absence. Urgent reasons shall be strictly construed and do not permit irregular attendance.

The Board considers the following conditions to constitute reasonable cause for absence from school:

Students beyond compulsory school age, who miss ten (10) consecutive school days, shall be dropped from the active membership roll unless the school is provided with evidence the excuse is legal, within the approved three (3) day provision. Students who accumulate more than forty-five (45) total days of unexcused absence shall be dropped from the active membership roll.[14][36][40]
