Aavidum (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Stoudt and Mrs. Judge – Library

Aavidum is a national organization that started in 2004 after a student died by suicide. Aavidum's goal is to create a positive mental health environment, a culture of "I Got Your Back" in schools and communities across the nation. At the core of Aavidum is an educational philosophy that empowers students to take responsibility to make a difference. Aavidum students are encouraged to use their gifts and talents to succeed and to recognize the gifts and talents of their peers. *Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form.*

Asian Pop Culture Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Ms. Ke. Frederick – Room 205

The Asian Pop Culture Club is designed to help teach people about Asian culture. Here, students do things such as watching anime, make crafts, play games, draw, read manga, listen to K-Pop/J-Pop, and much more.

Astronomy Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Farina & Mr. Bair – Room 016/Planetarium

Manheim Township Astronomy Club (MTAC) provides club members the ability to learn more about the universe they live in through the use of the Manheim Township Planetarium and through star watches conducted through our telescopes. Members are encouraged to help in conducting community outreach opportunities, such as planetarium shows and star watches for the public or elementary students, which can be used as community service hours. Fundraising plays a major role in our ability to provide club members new and exciting planetarium content and new observing gear such as telescopes and cameras. Club members also have the opportunity for field trips to various planetariums, museums, and observatories. Basketball Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Burkhart & Ms. Perez – South Gym

Enjoy playing hoops? This club is for those students who would like to play various games of knockout, 3 on 3, 4 on 4, or even 5 on 5. Take the time to get some good exercise while playing basketball.

Biology Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Myers & Mrs. Hyde – Room 216

The Bio club is for those who are interested in the life sciences. Participants will choose activities which might include experimenting, dissecting, setting up and maintaining aquaria, honors biology projects, science fair projects, planning field trips and biological photography. *Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form.*

Black Student Union (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Poliski – Room 129

The Black Student Union was first created in 1966. Since then, it has expanded to several high schools and colleges across the nation, and our hope is that MTHS can join that network of communities. The BSU is focused on the building of the black community, but membership is by no means limited to just the black community. In this organization we want to foster a fun and safe environment that engages our students in discussions on issues affecting us and our surrounding communities. We hope to educate our members then challenge them to take action, whether it be internal or external. We hope to lead by example and push students to be better than their best. We hope to show past generations that we will take charge of our future, dismantle the negative stereotypes, build and secure our sense of community, and influence the world. Our vision for BSU is to serve the Manheim Township student body with cultural, educational, and social initiatives as we aim to build leaders, promote unity and contribute to student success.

Blue Streak Connections Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. McCully– Room 161

This club is for students interested in being a mentor to a peer with special needs here at the high school. The goal of Blue Streak Connections is to develop a natural friendship in and out of the club setting. Mentors and mentees will meet during club periods as well as scheduled extracurricular activities such as game night, art night, the musical, a field trip to Black Rock, and a Barnstormers game. *Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.*

Blue Streak Investing Club (grades 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Frey – Room 007

This student-run club provides members with a learning experience in the field of Finance, as well as prepares them for a future in the field. The club will enter various contests, creating portfolios for a small fee. Members will analyze and invest in each portfolio, maximizing profit to score high on the leaderboards.

Board/Card Games Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Dr. Mast – Room 108

Board games is for students who would like to relax and have fun playing games such as: Boggle, Uno, Scrabble, Chess, Checkers, Connect 4, Hangman, Battleship, and/ or Backgammon.

Break Dancing Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Ms. Beauchamp – North Gym

The Break Dancing group is a club established by students and for students. The purpose of this club is for students to come together to refine break dancing skills and/or work toward a dance routine for events such as the Pep Rally. *Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form.*

BSN Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Pflieger – Room 137 (formerly Hi-Lite)

BSN Club plans and produces the fully multimedia online student publication (go.mtwp.net/bluestreaknews), the indispensable source of news, opinion and entertainment about Manheim Township High School. *Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. Academic eligibility is tracked for students in this club. Ineligible students may participate during the regular club period, but cannot participate in any after-school event or activity until they are passing and removed from the ineligible list. Members are required to pay a Student Activity Fee. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.*

Cars & Sodas Club (grades 11, 12) – Mr. Ziegler – Room 252

This club is open to any student who drives their car to school every day. Club members are encouraged to show off what they have done to customize their cars (stereos, wheels, paint, engine, interior, exterior, etc.). We will meet in room 252 every club period and then visit a few cars in the parking lot so we can see and hear what you have been working on. We will also discuss and plan to meet at outside events (Neffsville Car Show, Cars & Coffee, etc.).

Ceramics Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Bear – Room 164

This club is intended for students with prior ceramics knowledge who are able to work independently in a studio environment. Hand-building and wheel throwing skills will be utilized.

Chemistry Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Schulz – Room 118

Interested students should see Mr. Schulz in Room 118 for an application. Only those who have successfully completed chemistry at any level or are currently enrolled in chemistry will be considered. Interested students will provide a letter of recommendation, one from their past chemistry teacher (or biology or physical science teacher if they are currently in chemistry) with their completed application. Research, design, and practice your own chemistry demonstrations for the purpose of practicing the art of learning and teaching others through planned, well-presented, visual demonstrations of truths about the natural world that are often misconceived or unknown. This club will prepare students to do laboratory research and grow their skills in presenting by planning ahead and thinking on their feet. Both future scientists and teachers, especially elementary or science teachers, would benefit from learning how to show or do rather than only tell. Members will be required to sign a Laboratory Safety Agreement.

Chess Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Manning - Room 019

Chess Club is a club for students who enjoy the challenge and strategy of playing chess. Any student interested in playing chess is welcome, beginners or experts. Students will have the opportunity to play each other in tournaments and in friendly matches. Students who are new to chess will have the opportunity to learn the basics and begin building skills.

Collectible Card Games Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Kneier – Room 024

Do you want to try your hand at Magic the Gathering, Yu-Gi-Oh!, Pokémon, or other collectible card games? Bring your cards and let's play.

Coloring Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Patterson – Room 268 & Mrs. Krady - Room 256

Coloring has become a huge stress relieving activity and has resurfaced in popularity. Join us for a club designed to help us relax and have fun. We can provide coloring sheets, pencils, markers, etc., but you could also choose to bring your own supplies

Debate Club (grades 10, 11, 12) – Dr. Penner – Room 130

Fashion Art and Design Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Campbell & Mrs. Howery – Room 144

Students who are interested in developing a career in Fashion and Design are encouraged to join the Fashion Art and Design Club. This club offers students with a creative eye, opportunities to meet guest speakers, engage in fun activities, and interact with other students who share the same passion.

Fly Fishing Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Oberg – Room 017

Fly fishing club is for students who are interested in learning about fly fishing and fly tying. During the year we will learn about equipment, watch fly fishing videos and learn to tie some basic fly patterns.

Some club periods will also be devoted to watching and discussing current events news broadcasts or music videos. Since all content is in French, and subtitles are not always available, this club is limited to students currently enrolled in our French program or who speak French at home.

Friends of Rachel Club – Mrs. Myers (Room TBD)

Friends of Rachel (F.O.R.) is an organization for grades 9-12 that exists to create a cultural change that inspires compassion and hope throughout our school. By following the guidelines and ethics of "Rachel's Challenge" and the essays of Rachel Scott, F.O.R. supports and encourages students to start a chain reaction of kindness that will better our school and community. "Rachel's Challenge" is a dynamic program based on the writings and life of 17-year-old Rachel Scott who was the first student killed at Columbine High School in 1999. Rachel left a legacy of reaching out and helping others, acting to combat bullying, and performing acts of kindness and compassion. Shortly before her death she wrote, "I have this theory that if one person can go out of their way to show compassion, then it will start a chain reaction of the same. Geometric Art Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Impink – Room 212

Art through the eyes of a mathematician. In this club, you will build and create 2D and 3D geometric shapes and structures. Topics may include: Stellated Polyhedron, Hexaflexagon, Mobius Strip, Fibonacci/Golden Spiral, Fractals, Platonic Solids, Penrose Tiling, Pythagorean Tree, Parabolic Curves, Tessellations, Sierpinski Cube, and more. The club will be hands on. You do not have to have experience in art and you can be enrolled in any math class. Mrs. Impink recommends googling some of the topics listed to see if you would want to create them.

Gilmore Girls Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Miss Quain & Miss Peddie – Room 253

Do you love the TV show Gilmore Girls? Join us to watch episodes and drink coffee!

Girls Who Code (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Lyons & Mrs. Noll – Room 012

Computing is where the jobs are - and where they will be in the future, but fewer than 1 in 5 computer science graduates are women. Join a safe and supportive environment of peers and role models where girls learn to see themselves as computer scientists. Learn the concepts of loops, variables, conditionals, and functions that form the basis for all programming languages. Work in teams to design a computer science impact project that solves real-world problems that girls care about.

GSA Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Ms. Capelli & Mrs. Weller – Room 130

The MTHS Gender-Sexuality Alliance club provides a safe place for students to meet, support each other, discuss issues related to sexual orientation, and work to end homophobia. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form.***

Health Careers Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) - Mrs. Phillips - Room 105

The program will create an educational atmosphere by periodic introductory level lectures delivered by volunteering community Health Care professionals (Doctors, Nurses, Technicians, IT Professionals). The club will meet periodically, and one of the voluntary community Health Professionals will give an introductory level lecture with an emphasis on his/her personal biography focused on their journey from High School to their current day status including college years, application for Professional School (Medical School, Nursing School, etc), training after Professional School and professional experience. The club will arrange volunteering opportunities with the area community hospitals. During some club periods, the club will research certain medical careers. Also we will provide information about paid summer programs for High School students who are interested in the field of Medicine in the nearby Medical Schools and Universities.

Interact members must complete at least 20 hours of community service each year. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. Academic eligibility is tracked for students in this club. Ineligible students may participate during the regular club period, but cannot participate in any after-school event or activity until they are passing and removed from the ineligible list. Members are required to pay a Student Activity Fee. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.***

Key Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Aiello & Mr. Sneeringer – Convo Hall/Right

Key Club is an international student-led organization which provides its members with opportunities to provide service, build character and develop leadership. Members will participate in club-sponsored projects that benefit people within the school district, local community, and globally. Members are required to pay dues to Key Club International and participate in a minimum amount of community service projects in order to remain in the club each year. Students must apply for membership in advance of the following school year. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. Academic eligibility is tracked for students in this club. Ineligible students may participate during the regular club period, but cannot participate in any after-school event or activity until they are passing and removed from the ineligible list. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.***

Kickball Club ((grades 9, 10, 11 & 12) – Mr. Baker & Mr. Donmoyer (131 or outside)

Weather permitting, we will go outside and play kickball all year. When the weather does not cooperate, we will stay inside room 131 and watch English Premier League soccer highlights.

Link Crew (grades 10, 11 & 12) – Mrs. Deibler & Mrs. Eshelman – Room 231

Link Crew is a high school transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout their high school experience. Built on the belief that students can help students succeed, Link Crew trains members of the junior and senior classes to be Link Leaders. As positive role models, Link Leaders are motivators, leaders and teachers who guide the freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful during the transition to high school and help facilitate freshman success. This is a pre-selected club. Interested sophomores and juniors should apply in March to become potential Link Crew leaders for the following school year. If selected, leaders can meet during the club period, but this is not a requirement. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.***

Lions' Leo Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Kantz & Mr. L. Wagner – Room 030

The Lions' Leo Club is a service organization and is open to both male and female teenagers with a willingness to do community service. Please note that it is a requirement to participate in out of school service projects. The Lions' Leo Club is affiliated with the Manheim Township Lions Club. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.***

Math 24 Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Miss Seibel – Room 179

Math 24 club is for students who are interesting in playing the game Math 24. It's so simple: just make the number 24 from the four numbers on the card using basic mathematical operations. A variety of levels and skills will be played, including one integer up through variables, and beyond. If you enjoy games and mathematical operations, this club is for you!

Meditation Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Biddle – Room 111

Meditation promotes harmony and self-realization through meditation, repetition of a mantra, and other yogic practices. For each person, the aspired goal of mediation may involve God, the Divine, the compassionate nature of the universe, or just a sense of gratitude for life. Ineligible students may participate during the regular club period, but cannot participate in any after-school event or activity until they are passing and removed from the ineligible list.***

MT Technology & Engineering Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Nolt & Mr. Campbell – Room 189

MT Technology & Engineering Club (MT TEC) membership offers exciting regional and national STEM competition and leadership opportunities. Club members will compete in individual and/or team-oriented STEM contests offered by Technology Student Association (TSA) and FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC Robotics).

Music Improv Club (grades 9, 10, 11 & 12) – Mrs. Harnly – Room 209

Music Practice and Performance Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Schlosser – Room 157

This club is open to all instrumental and vocal students interested in practicing and developing material for lessons/sectionals and their performance repertoire. Time will be given for students to practice individually and/or with a small group. Three recitals will be held during the year. Students enrolled in this club should be prepared to perform in one of these recitals. Performance material can include: exercises, etudes, audition pieces, concert repertoire, original compositions, or demonstration of techniques. During these recitals each student will have the chance to practice playing their repertoire in a low-stress performance situation.

Neff-Vue Yearbook Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Wolfe & Mrs. Schiffhauer – Room 124

Neff-Vue is open to any student who submitted an application to be a member of the yearbook staff. Being in Neff-Vue is a great way to meet new friends and express oneself creatively. Each student's contribution to the yearbook can be seen come to fruition when the yearbooks arrive in May. After being trained in how to use the Jostens Yearbook Avenue Design Program, students are given the opportunity to design a yearbook spread that they should work on both at club meetings and at home. Throughout the course of the year, club members are expected to help out with various other yearbook-related tasks including photography, page design, student and faculty interviews, caption and article writing, senior-select tallying, and yearbook distribution. Members are required to pay a Student Activity Fee. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.***

Open Art Studio Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Jones – Room 162

This club is intended for students who want to draw people from real life. There will be a clothed live model every club for students to draw.

Operation Smile (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mr. Mazreku – Room 177

“Operation Smile” is a service-based organization with the primary focus of fundraising to donate toys and supplies to fund operations of facial deformities, such as cleft palate, in underdeveloped countries. ***Club members and their parents must sign the Policy Signature Sheet and Mandatory Drug Test Consent Form.***

Photography Club is for any student who has an interest in photography at any level, digital or film. The club will meet to discuss and practice techniques in the hope of improving the quality of the photography of the group. It is a goal to have this group use their honed skills in some way to provide a service to the community.

Ineligible students may participate during the regular club period, but cannot participate in any after-school event or activity until they are passing and removed from the ineligible list. This is a pre-assigned club – membership in this club has already been determined.

Senior Early Release – Office

Seniors will have the option of early release on club days provided they complete the appropriate paperwork and meet the requirements. Seniors must sign up online **AND** complete the Senior Privilege Application (available in the main office). Administrative approval is required.

Silent Reading Club (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) – Mrs. Hoffer – Room 264

This club is for students who would like a quiet environment for pleasure reading. Students can bring any material to read for pleasure. By joining the club, students agree to maintain a silent reading environment. Members are required to pay a Student Activity Fee.***
