General Information

The Summer School Program developed by the Manheim Township School District offers students an opportunity to expand and/or strengthen their knowledge of concepts and skills. Curricular guides used during the regular school term are followed by summer school teachers to present courses for which students will receive credit, with the exception of courses taken for grade improvement. For summer 2021, all courses will be run virtually. All courses will contain an orientation meeting, listed in the course description. Some meetings require students to come to the HS, while others are held online. A parent is encouraged to attend the orientation meetings online.

Non-residents: A **\$150.00 deposit** (per class) is due with the registration form and the balance is due before first class meets.

MTSD Physical Education, Health, PFL, CP Geometry, CP English 9, CP English 10, CP Ancient World History, CP Modern World History, and Honors Physical Science courses have a maximum enrollment of 30 students. A waiting list will be maintained for students if the maximum enrollment is exceeded.

REGISTRATION: Students will be registered on a first come, first served basis through MySchoolBucks. Priority will be given to upperclassmen attempting to recover a credit. A waiting list will be created for courses if necessary.

Guidelines and Expectations

Manheim Township Summer School offers online courses through MTSD teacher created courses and Lancaster-Lebanon Virtual Solutions (LLVS). All school rules apply for students in the virtual setting. Please refer to the 2020-21 Student Handbook, located under High School Downloads & Documents on the Manheim Township District website for specific school rules of conduct.

Students are expected to follow the suggested pacing for each course. Instructors will regularly record student progress in the virtual platform to keep students and parents/guardians updated. Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to check student progress regularly and contact the instructor with any questions or concerns.

NOTES REGARDING NON-MTHS SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES:

1. Prior approval is required through the MTHS Counseling office in order to receive credit for any advanced or credit recovery summer school courses from other school districts.
2. The only summer school PE courses that will be accepted for credit are through Manheim Township School District, School District of Lancaster (McCaskey), and Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) Dual Enrollment (must meet with your counselor.)

Credits: 0.5 (this course satisfies the Health requirement for graduation)

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery or Advancement

This course includes an examination of mental, emotional, physiological and social health issues of young adults. Emphasis will be placed on healthful decision-making, long and short-term goal setting; looking into the future of one's quality of life will be discussed, debated and researched. Students will be engaged in learning aspects of human anatomy and physiology related to problems associated with disease prevention and how to determine and access good healthful information based on reliable media and other associated sources of information. *Students **must** attend the orientation sessions listed below.*

Virtual Personal Financial Literacy (sum.00.02) **REGISTRATION CLOSED**

Credits: 0.5 (this course satisfies the Financial Literacy requirement for graduation)

Grades: 11 & 12

Course Window: June 15 - July 26

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery or Advancement

In this course, students will learn to make informed decisions as consumers. They will develop knowledge and skills related to income and responsible spending, including: banking, financial planning, credit, saving, investing, and purchasing insurance. Personal finance and business simulation software is used extensively through the course to provide unique, authentic experiences that require conscientious decision making.

Students who have passed the classroom Personal Financial Literacy or Honors Personal Financial Literacy course are not eligible to take this course. This course satisfies the financial literacy graduation requirement. *Students **must** attend the orientation session listed below.*

Virtual CP Ancient World History (sum.00.04)

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery _____

The Ancient World History course begins with the prehistoric period of human development and continues through Early Civilizations, the development of Empires, the Ancient Greeks and Romans, the Kingdoms of Africa, great civilizations in India and China, Islamic Civilizations and Empires and ends with the Rise of Medieval Europe. Students will read both primary and secondary sources and will participate in historical inquiry and analysis. Our historical study will seek to link ancient history themes to modern American and global developments. *Students **must** attend the orientation session listed below.*

Virtual CP Modern World History (sum.00.05)

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery

The CP Modern World History course examines the many societies of the world by focusing on cultural developments from 1500 to the present. Included in the study are the geography, history, economics and political institutions of Africa, Asia, Latin America and Europe. Students will read both primary and secondary sources and will participate in historical inquiry and analysis. Our historical study will seek to link themes and patterns of history to modern issues in our world. *Students **must** attend the orientation session listed below.*

Virtual CP Geometry (sum.00.10)

Grades: 10, 11, & 12

Course Window: June 15 - July 26

This course may be taken for Advancement or Credit Recovery

This course builds on the concepts and skills developed in CP Algebra 1 and geometry skills developed throughout previous courses. While there will be suggested and set due dates, the online format of the course will allow students the flexibility to set their own schedule and work at their own pace. Given the course timeframe, students will cover roughly 2-3 chapters per week, and should allow ample time to learn, practice the content, and seek additional help as needed. Learning will take place through direct instructional videos, interactive online work spaces such as Classkick and ixl, two projects, as well as optional zoom meetings with the instructor. Students are required to complete an in-person midterm and final. *Students **must** also attend the orientation session listed below.*

Virtual CP English 9-10 (sum.00.18 and sum.00.19)

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery

This course is designed to allow remediation for students who have failed an English course during the school year. The course will draw upon the curriculum guides of English 9 – 10 and will offer individualized instruction based on the student's needs and prior academic performance. This course will begin with two intensive weeks of instruction followed by activities where students complete independent, in-class coursework. Students will complete a term paper during the summer. Virtual Honors Physical Science (sum.00.20) **REGISTRATION CLOSED**

Grades: 8, 9, 10

Course Window: June 15 - July 26

This course may be taken for Advancement

This course is for accelerated and self-motivated students who excelled in Algebra 1 (85% or higher) and science in 8th grade (89% or higher) and would like to take Physical Science before the beginning of the school year. Students who have excelled in Algebra IA and Life Science (85% or higher in both) may take this course at the end of their 9th or 10th grade year. For those students who are motivated to work hard, this course will cover the essential content of the traditional Honors Physical Science course in order to prepare them to take Honors Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. **This course will be entered as PASS/FAIL for 8th graders. All other students will have a grade and percentage issued to their transcript. This schedule is based on current calendar parameters which are subject to change.** Students ***must*** attend the orientation session listed below ***in person*** and parents are also encouraged to attend ***via Zoom***.

Virtual Physical Education (sum.0.21) **REGISTRATION CLOSED**

Credits: .5 (for credit recovery or advanced credit)

Cost: \$300

Grade: 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12

Course Window: June 15 - July 26

This course may be taken for Credit Recovery or Advancement

This course is intended for those students wishing to earn one of the three required credits in physical education. Normally this course is completed in school, several hours a day, for a few weeks. During this online adapted version of the course, participants will be expected to perform, and submit, weekly workouts using a school-issued heart rate monitor. Students will also participate in online learning with an emphasis on project-based activities. This online learning will take place on Schoology. Grading will be based on the combination of workout criteria and Schoology projects. Students ***must attend one of the in person orientation sessions listed below. Heart Rate monitors will be distributed during the orientation sessions.***

All of these courses can be taken by students who have previously failed these live courses or would like to take the course for grade improvement without credit. The online course work is delivered through Lancaster Lebanon Virtual Solutions (LLVS) and the Geniusis Online Program: The Geniusis Online Program is designed so that students can move through it at a pace that meets individual needs. Accommodations and modifications are made on an individual basis for students who need specially designed instruction.

KEYSTONE EXAM: We will be looking to PDE for direction moving forward with the Keystone Exam. Typically the Keystone Exam is taken at the end of the summer school to any student needing to retake the exam for Algebra 1, Biology, or English 10. Once we have more information from PDE, instructors will reach out to students and families. *Students **must** attend the orientation session listed below.*
