

**Report Cards** were distributed Tuesday during Primetime. Students who did not receive their report card can pick them up from Mrs. Faller in the main office.

**DRESS CODE REMINDER:** Now that spring has sprung, it is time to remind everyone that we do have a school dress code. Please remember that straps on shirts should be at least two inches wide and should cover the back and chest completely, including the tops of breasts. Shorts must be long enough that there is material on the back of the legs between the wearer and the seat of their chair. If in doubt, measure the inseam of the shorts - it should at least be about four inches long - or check by having your student hang their arms loosely at their sides. The bottom of the shorts should be at least as long as the tip of the longest finger. Skirts or dresses must be two inches below the tip of the longest finger when arms are loosely at their sides. Leggings may be worn under shorter garments, but may not be worn alone. Foot coverings must be worn at all times when in school - shoes, sandals or flip-flops are acceptable. Please be aware that if student attire does not meet the school dress code, students will be asked to change clothes. If you do not have a change of clothes, one will be provided for you or you will be asked to call your parents to bring you clothes to wear that meet the dress code. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask an administrator or faculty member or refer to the dress code section of the student handbook in your agenda/passport.

**Attention Student Drivers:** Please remember the following which are part of the privilege of parking on campus:

- You must have a valid hang tag on your rearview mirror to park on campus
- Your tag must be visible through your windshield
- You may **ONLY** park in white lined spaces in the student lots. Do not park in the teacher lot, yellow lined spaces, visitor spaces, along the curb, in front of fire hydrants, or in the handicap spaces
- Parking tags are color coded for specific parking lots, please make sure you are parking in the correct parking lot for your parking tag

These and other regulations related to the privilege of parking on campus are outlined in your signed parking agreement and serve as your only warning. If you are in violation of the parking regulations, you will be fined according to the fine schedule in your agreement. Accumulation of fines may result in the loss of parking privileges.

For any subsequent confiscations, a disciplinary consequence will be assigned and the device will only be released to the student's parent/guardian.
