

This message is for any student who will be taking the Literature, Biology and/or Algebra Keystone Exam. On Wednesday, May 13th and Friday, May 15th any student who is currently in a 10th grade English class or an 11th grader who has not obtained a Proficient Score on the Literature Keystone Exam will be required to take the Literature Keystone Exam. On Monday, May 18th and Tuesday, May 19th any student who is currently in a Biology class will be required to take the Biology Keystone Exam. On Wednesday, May 20th and Thursday, May 21st any student who is currently in CP Algebra 1 Part 2 or Honors Algebra 1 will take the Algebra Keystone Exam. The test sessions will run from 7:40 a.m. – 9:25 a.m. during each testing day. These are mandatory state exams that all students must take and for students in the Class of 2017 must pass before graduating from high school. Please make every attempt to be in school, and on-time during the Keystone Exam days! Each student will be assigned to a testing room. Testing room locations have been posted in various locations throughout the school building. **No electronic devices, including cell phones, cameras, and iPods may be in your possession within the testing room.** Please leave all electronic devices in your locker, in your back pack, or at home during Keystone Exam days. Failure to comply will result in severe disciplinary consequences. Students who do not score Proficient or Advanced will be required to retake the exam during the '15-'16 school year.
