This message is for any student who will be taking the Biology and/or Algebra Keystone Exam. Today, May 19th any student who is currently in a Biology class will be required to take the Biology Keystone Exam. On Wednesday, May 20th and Thursday, May 21st any student who is currently in CP Algebra 1 Part 2 or Honors Algebra 1 will take the Algebra Keystone Exam. The test sessions will run from 7:40 a.m. – 9:25 a.m. during each testing day. These are mandatory state exams that all students must take and for students in the Class of 2017 must pass before graduating from high school. Please make every attempt to be in school, and on-time during the Keystone Exam days! Each student will be assigned to a testing room. Testing room locations have been posted in various locations throughout the school building. **No electronic devices, including cell phones, cameras, and iPods may be in your possession within the testing room.** Please leave all electronic devices in your locker, in your back pack, or at home during Keystone Exam days. Failure to comply will result in severe disciplinary consequences. Students who do not score Proficient or Advanced will be required to retake the exam during the '15-'16 school year.

The Course Selection Timeline for 2015-16 has been revised as follows:

- Students will receive a list of their courses for the 2015-16 school year on Thursday, 5/21 during a special Primetime.
- The DROP & ADD period will now take place May 22-29. This will be the ONLY drop and add period available.
- If you need to drop or add a class, you can sign up for an appointment during the special Primetime. Depending upon the number of requests, some students may be seen AFTER the drop/add period – but only if they have signed up for an appointment during the drop/add time.

SENIORS: Senior awards night is Wednesday, May 20th at 7 PM. All seniors are welcome to attend. Any students that received invites and are unable to attend, please notify Mrs. Ridley in the main office.
