AP Exam Registration will be held online through Naviance until March 10th. Students must sign up for each exam by completing the AP Registration Survey under the ABOUT ME tab on Naviance. The fee for each exam is \$93. Students must bring payment, along with their printed registration form from Naviance to the Guidance Office by 3:30 on March 10th. Additional details were provided in AP Classes and will be posted on Naviance. Any exams ordered after that time will be subject to a \$55 late penalty. Exams will be administered May 1-May 11. Students must see Mrs. Ziegler if they cannot take their exam on the scheduled date. Check the AP website for more information or see Mrs. Ziegler.

Students taking the SAT's on Saturday: Enter through the main lobby doors. Doors will open at 7:30 a.m. and close PROMPTLY at 8:00 a.m. Please bring your admissions ticket, a valid photo ID, #2 pencils, and a calculator. Mechanical pencils are not allowed. If you do not have your admissions ticket and a valid photo ID you will not be permitted to test! The name on your admissions ticket must exactly match the name on your photo ID. It is advised not to bring a cell phone. If your cell phone makes any noise during testing you will be dismissed and your scores will be canceled.

Attention 9th & 10th Grade Students: If you signed up for the PSAT 10 on Saturday, April 8th, please stop by the guidance office to pick up your PSAT 10 Student Guide and Practice Test.
