Today, many of you will be taking the Keystone Exams. These tests are an important measure of your academic progress. Your Keystone class teachers will be letting you know where you should report for each test. You can also get this information from any staff member.

All cell phones, smart watches and any other electronic devices are not permitted to be in your possession while testing. They must be turned off and left in your backpack or locker.

Consequences for being found with a cell phone or other electronic device include:

- Test will be labeled Do Not Score and student must retake assessment at make-up time
- The phone or device will be confiscated and in the presence of the parent/guardian, the phone will be viewed to ensure that no information or material regarding the assessment is present
- Parents and students may be responsible financially for replacing any compromised material

The tests begin at 7:40 and morning attendance is taken at 7:30 so be sure to be on time or you will be required to take the test during a make-up period.

To the rest of our students: Testing is taking place in the E wing (long hallway) on the entire second floor and the end of the hallway of the first floor. You will not be permitted in those areas during testing, so plan accordingly.

Lockers: Whether you use your assigned locker or not you must empty your locker, leave the door open with the lock locked on the hasp. Failure to do so will result in a \$10.00 locker clean-out fee. Seniors will clean out their lockers during English class on Friday, May 26th and must have their lockers cleaned out by the end of the day, Friday, May 26st. We will run a Primetime schedule on June 2nd for underclassmen to clean out their lockers. Please stop by the main office if you don't remember your locker combination prior to your locker clean-out day.

Starting today, <u>**Tuesday, May 23**</u>, no students will be allowed to charge meals (i.e. go into a negative balance, owe money) on their lunch accounts.
